Tuesday night fights return July 22 to Remington Park

Remington Park will host a summer night of boxing on July 22 as the Tuesday Night Fights return. Some of the best undefeated boxers in the country will be on the eight-bout card with five professional matchups and three amateur fights.

The fight arena and ring will be set just inside the casino lobby. Seating will begin at 6 p.m. and the first punch of the opening bout will be thrown at 6:30 p.m. Remington Park will open at 10 a.m. July 22 and remain open for casino gaming and simulcast racing until midnight.

The Main Event features undefeated super-middleweight George "Comanche Boy" Tahdooahnippah, who sports a record of 12 wins and one draw with 11 knockouts to his credit. A member of the Comanche Nation, Tahdooahnippah proudly displays his heritage as he enters the ring.

Undefeated lightweight Noah Zuhdi returns for his third Remington Park appearance. Zuhdi is perfect through two career fights, sending both of his opponents to defeat by knockout in prior bouts at Remington. A former starting point guard for Saint Gregory University, Zuhdi is coached by former World Lightweight Champion Sean O'Grady.

Undefeated super-featherweight James DuBois (6-0, 2 KOs) is traveling from San Antonio to box in a four-round fight. DuBois fought at Remington Park last November

and bested his opponent with a first-round knockout. Also appearing on the card is welterweight Kyle Sherman, scheduled for a four-round fight. Sherman had more than 110 fights as an amateur before turning pro. His pro record is 9-1 with six knockouts.

Manuel Esparza (19-8) makes his comeback in the light-heavyweight division against super-tough Terrence Jones (10-11). Among the fights on the Esparza resume is a bout against former WBC Champion Hector "Macho" Camacho. The top-ranked amateur in the country and a two-time champion, Alex Secoda from Oklahoma City will be making his third appearance at Remington. Secoda, a technically accurate fighter, holds two National Championship belts.

The July 22 fight card is subject to change without notice. Other fighters and/or bouts could be announced or presented at the discretion of the promoter, CatBOX Entertainment, Inc.

Country singer Darla Z will be performing "God Bless America" before the Main Event. Darla Z has opened in concert for country legend Willie Nelson and has performed in concert numerous times to sold out crowds at Sam's Town Casino in Las Vegas.
